The sport of Working Equitation is the ultimate outcome of the development of the horse as a working animal.

Horses were originally domesticated and trained for farming and herding purposes, work which required them to respond to their rider whatever terrain and difficulties they may face. The sport is a highly refined and sophisticated demonstration of these activities, but with the added required quality of elegance and speed of execution. It comprises 3 phases. Dressage, Ease of handling, Speed and at International level, cattle penning. For this clinic I understand that trail-type obstacles are involved, so have some fun with your horse (whatever your tack).

NOTES:

Horse accommodation

You will be responsible for the care and handling of your own horse during the weekend You **must** leave your paddock clean and poo-picked before you go. If you book a stable you will be responsible for mucking out and throwing the bed away when you go. Please clear up any mess you make when moving your horse around, moving and soaking hay, mucking out etc. Any gates must be kept shut at all times.

Riders – equipment

Bring whatever tack and equipment you normally use with your horse. We ask that you wear a current standard safety helmet. For when you're watching - Notebook, camcorder, comfy chair. If you can bring tools and barrows for poo picking it's a really good idea and will save you waiting to borrow stuff.

Everyone

Bring wet and dry weather clothing – if it rains you may get wet. A torch will be useful. Basically, be prepared for anything as we had could have blazing sun and torrential rain in the same day - you know what the British weather is like (sunshine & warm temperatures in Feb!).

Admin issues

Please make sure you have adequate insurance for your horse. The ApHC UK Ltd and The Crescent Arena cannot be held responsible for accidents that happen however incurred at the venue, before, during or after the Camp Weekend. Remember that it is now a legal requirement that you carry your horse's passport when travelling, failure to do this can result in a £1,000 fine. Also: NO DOGS and preferably no children under 16 please.

Please bring all feed, hay/haynets, bedding (if using stables), tools, buckets etc with you and take all rubbish away with you please.

Please note: Alcoholic beverages are not to be brought or consumed at venue.
